ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL COMMITMENT PLAN

1. The Palestine Liberation Organization for the benefit of the Palestinian Authority (the Recipient) is implementing the Social Recovery and Job Creation Project in West Bank and Gaza (the Project), under the responsibility of the Ministry of Finance and Planning (MoFP), as the agency with the involvement of the Municipal Development Lending Fund (MDLF) responsible for the implementation of Component 1 of the Project and with the NGO Development Centre (NDC) as the agency responsible for the implementation of Component 2 of the Project, all in coordination with the Ministry of Local Government (MoLG), Ministry of Agriculture (MoA), Prime minister's office (PMO), and the Ministry of Labor (MoL), and as set out in the Trust Fund Grant Agreement (the Agreement). The International Bank for Reconstruction and Development/International Development Association (the Bank), acting as the administrator of the Trust Fund for Gaza and the West Bank, has agreed to provide additional financing for the Project, as set out in the Agreement. This ESCP supersedes previous versions of the ESCP for the Project and shall apply both to the original and the additional financing for the Project referred to above.
2. The Recipient shall ensure that the Project is carried out in accordance with the Environmental and Social Standards (ESSs) and this Environmental and Social Commitment Plan (ESCP), in a manner acceptable to the Bank. The ESCP is a part of the Agreement. Unless otherwise defined in this ESCP, capitalized terms used in this ESCP have the meanings ascribed to them in the Agreement.
3. Without limitation to the foregoing, this ESCP sets out material measures and actions that the Recipient shall carry out or cause to be carried out, including, as applicable, their respective timeframes; institutional, staffing, training, monitoring and reporting arrangements; and grievance management. The ESCP also sets out the environmental and social (E&S) documents that shall be prepared or updated, consulted, disclosed and implemented under the Project, consistent with the ESSs, in form and substance acceptable to the Bank. The Bank may revise said E&S documents from time to time with prior written agreement. As provided for under the referred Agreement, the Recipient shall ensure that there are sufficient funds available to cover the costs of implementing the ESCP.
4. As agreed by the Bank and the Recipient, this ESCP will be revised from time to time, if necessary, to reflect adaptive management of Project changes or unforeseen circumstances or in response to Project performance. In such circumstances, the Bank and the Recipient agree to update the ESCP to reflect these changes through an exchange of letters signed between the Bank and the Recipient's Representative specified in the Agreement or Minister of MoFP. The Recipient shall promptly disclose the updated ESCP.
5. The subsection on "Indicators for Implementation Readiness" below identifies the actions and measures to be monitored to assess Project readiness to begin implementation in accordance with this ESCP. Nevertheless, all actions and measures in this ESCP shall be implemented as set out in the "Timeframe" column below irrespective of whether they are listed in the referred subsection.
